MMC Single Board July 18, 2023 6:08 PM Conference Room

Mark Reth opened the meeting with a devotion and reading Exodus 34:27-29. He felt this applied as we are starting a new chapter but still the same and different name but same story.

Prayers and praises were lifted up followed by a prayer for guidance by Pastor Phil.

Finance: Bruce gave the Financial Report that showed our actual income for June was \$26,569 and the actual expenses were \$23,121.15. There has not been any reference to the new apportionment. There has been

correspondence from the Foundation, indicating that there was no reason to change the name on the investments, but that would be done. All of the items necessary for disaffiliation have been sent and received and all of the adjustments to the financial reports have been made effective June 30. The new account has been opened at F&M.

Action Item: Recommendation from committee that excess funds that are currently in Designated Funds in the amount of \$45,000.00 be invested in Certificate of Deposits at F&M for 18 months @ 3.8%. Approved unanimously.

Trustees: There was nothing to report from the committee. A quote from Nesper Sign was presented to change all of the signage on the building and the other signs. This quote will go to the Trustees for approval.

Worship: Discussion has been held with Comelec to change the internet to fiber. This is not available at this time, but will be in the near future. At that time, there will be further investigation into changing the phone system.

Mission: The Ice Cream Social is set for July 26th. There are still food items needed and also help during the Social. There will be a silent auction and several items have been received and several more have been

promised.

SP/PRC: No report

Reaching & Receiving: The fair float went very well. The logo was discussed and a decision was made to have a cross with a descending dove. There will also be new T-shirts ordered.

Congregational Care: Members who have been absent from service will be sent a card.

Pastor Phil: The RAHAB board is nearly ready to be official. The Manchester Press was in for an interview to discuss disaffiliation. He also discussed the camp that he attended the week of July 10-14.

Our next meeting will be on Tuesday, August 15, 2023 at 6:00PM in Wesley Hall. The meeting was adjourned at 8:00PM followed by The Lord's Prayer.
