A note from Pastor Phil...

4 Surely he took up our pain and bore our suffering, yet we considered him punished by God, stricken by him, and afflicted.
5 But he was pierced for our transgressions, he was crushed for our iniquities; the punishment that brought us peace was on him, and by his wounds we are healed.
6 We all, like sheep, have gone astray, each of us has turned to our own way; and the Lord has laid on him the iniquity of us all. -Isaiah 53:4-6

Isaiah 53 details the prophecy of the suffering, death, and resurrection of the anointed one of God, the Messiah. But what does this mean? Oftentimes scripture, especially the Old Testament can be hard to understand. I think this scripture is pretty plain language and easy to understand though.

The Messiah received the punishment of the wrath of God that humanity deserved. Not just some, not even some more than others, all of humanity is guilty of sin and deserving of God's wrath. But God's anointed Messiah intervenes for us and bore the suffering due to the iniquity of man. But humanity did not reveal gratitude for this redeeming grace, instead they cried "crucify" as if the Messiah was deserving of this punishment, though the Messiah was without sin. The Messiah was pierced for our transgressions, crushed for our iniquities, and in final death paid the price of sin in full, shared His Own righteousness with us, so that we could be at peace with God. because of the human condition the stain of sin on our righteousness is made clean, washed in the blood of the Messiah's sacrifice... And in this way, the only possible way, we are now at peace with God in judgment. Though we have turned away from God, God's Messiah has accepted all our brokenness so that we may be redeemed and forgiven.

This is a wonderful prophecy of good news! Yet it is also a tragic story of humanity's inability to remain faithful to God and uphold God's perfect Law. In our human condition humanity is broken and stained in filth. So God's Messiah, Redeemer, Savior, comes to do that which we can not do for ourselves, and in perfect sacrifice builds the pathway forward to be acceptable before God.

But in the unconditional perfect love of God this alone is not enough. Read these words as the prophecy continues in verse 11:

11 After he has suffered, he will see the light of life and be satisfied; by his knowledge my righteous servant will justify many, and he will bear their iniquities. -Isajah 43:11

God's Messiah will bear the iniquities of God's people for all time. Being the Light of Life the Messiah will overcome the grave and live for all eternity. Because of this humanity has the invitation and ability to remain in relationship with God forever.

All this was prophesied 750-800 years before the suffering, death, and resurrection of God's Messiah, Jesus, the Savior of all who choose to accept and believe. God made sure to tell us in prophecy so that when it happened we will know that our salvation was always God's plan and desire. God loves us that much.

2000 years later, even though we do not like to admit it, we still cry crucify praying that in death is our salvation, and in resurrection our eternal promise. We still need a Savior.

In this time of Lent we are to prepare our hearts and minds to acknowledge the cost of our sin, and in thanksgiving praise God's Messiah, Jesus Christ, for delivering us beyond our brokenness to live free at peace with God. Let us be faithful in our worship and, though it may be hard, walk this Journey of salvation with Jesus and in prayers of thanksgiving that His love is enough to save even us from the wrath of God we deserve. In maturity of faith let us experience every moment of sorrow, shame, arrest, pain, suffering, death, so that we are truly prepared in joy to appreciate the grace received and the promise of eternity.

Holy begins Sunday March 24th with Palm Sunday through Easter Sunday March 31st. We will have special worship services on Wednesday March 27th at 6:30, Maundy Thursday March 28th, and Good Friday March 29th both at 7:00. There will be a meal on Wednesday starting at 5:30.

I hope that we will all join in fullness as a church family to worship together in the special Lenten services.

MMC Single Board January 30, 2024 6:00 p.m. - Wesley Hall

Present: Carlie Dighton, Pastor Phil, Bruce Nodurft, Mark Reth, Beth Mueller, Jean Gross, Sherry Goranson, Kathy Dolan, Shirley Davis.

Mark opened the meeting with scripture from Ephesians 6: 10-11, "Be strong in the Lord and in his mighty power. Put on the full armor of God, so that you can take your stand against the devil's schemes." Mark reminded us that during these turbulent times we need to remain diligent when it comes to spiritual matters and remain strong in our faith. Prayers and praises were lifted up followed by a prayer for guidance from Pastor Phil.

Finance: Bruce gave the year end financial report. With December contributions we ended the year with a small surplus. Giving in 2023 was down approximately \$20,000 from the previous year. The actual expenses for last year were \$236,276 and the actual income was \$236,521. The Brick-by-Brick campaign contributions in December were \$4800 bringing that total to \$47,617 after \$95,373 in expenses for 2023.

Trustees: Charlie reported the Trustees will be deciding where to proceed next with building improvements. Remodeling the back entryway to make it handicapped accessible is one possibility along with moving the offices to the east wing.

Worship: New banners are coming for Easter and the staging in the sanctuary has been improved to make it more stable.

Christian Ed.: There are four students in confirmation who will be confirmed on Mother's Day. Paul Lyman and Kristin Milroy are teaching the class.

Missions: Wayne reported that \$1100 was raised from the soup supper and those funds have been sent to Waypoint. Three employees from this women's shelter were at the soup supper to express their thanks and to tell us about their mission. The mission team will be looking for candidates for their Paint by Neighbor endeavor this summer.

Reaching and Receiving: New name badges are in the works and there has been some consideration of a new Pictorial Directory for our church.

Congregational Care: A Valentine's Day light luncheon is being planned for noon. Roger Mueller will share some music with us.

Mark shared an Articles of Dissolution that needs to be completed for the Iowa Secretary of State. This form

was filled out and signed by the board leadership and will be sent along with a five dollar filing fee to the Secretary of State. This is the final act in our dissolution from the Manchester United Methodist Church affiliation.

Pastor has written a Lenten Devotional booklet that will be available soon. He is encouraging small groups to meet during Lent for some light discussion on the material. Those interested in guiding a small group or hosting one can let the office know.

Our next regular board meeting is scheduled for March 19 at 6:00 p.m. in Wesley Hall. Meeting adjourned at 7:30 p.m. followed by the Lord's Prayer and singing of the Doxology.


