# A note from Pastor Phil...

# A cheerful heart is good medicine, but a crushed spirit dries up the bones. - Proverbs 12:22

Is it just me or does it seem that life has become more maddening? I recognize that I may fall into the grouchy old man desiring the "good old days" category, but does it appear that our technological and societal progression have brought us to a greater life and community? In the last 5 years we have experienced together a contentious election cycle, a pandemic, disaffiliation, participating in starting a new denomination, another contentious election cycle, and now everyone views themselves as an intellectual in social media decrying others thoughts and opinions because they are mean spirited, uninformed, whatever wing, nazi, hatemongers...I want to tap out. Perhaps my bones are the dry bones of a crushed spirit. But is this my reality, or just a point of view I have chosen? Am I not equally able to choose a joyful outlook as well. Jesus has chosen me (and you) to be a part of this unique time from this unique place, one that seems impossibly difficult and full of discord, to proclaim the Good News for all to hear so that they may know, repent, and be saved.

<sup>35</sup>Jesus went through all the towns and villages, teaching in their synagogues, proclaiming the good news of the kingdom and healing every disease and sickness. <sup>36</sup>When he saw the crowds, he had compassion on them, because they were harassed and helpless, like sheep without a shepherd. <sup>37</sup>Then he said to his disciples, "The harvest is plentiful but the workers are few. <sup>38</sup>Ask the Lord of the harvest, therefore, to send out workers into his harvest field." - Matthew 9:35-38

This may seem to be one of the most difficult times in modern history to share the Good News. We live in this unique time where everyone has an opinion with an intolerance for any other opinion. How can we who only wish to preach the gospel with great passion and joy be heard above all the other "noise" in our world? ### Manchester Methodist Church Single Board Reports for February 2025

Due to no in-person Single Board in February, the following reports were shared:

**Finance:** Bruce reported that January expenses were \$20,587 and the January contributions were \$16,521 leaving us with a shortfall in January of -\$4,066.

**Trustees:** No report...however, it is noted that the Pastor's and Lynne's offices are completed and they have moved to their new locations. Also, Finance is now in Pastor Phil's old office. Lynne's old office will become a cry room for parents with young children.

**Christian Ed:** Paul reported that there is a looming education staffing shortage and a need for teaching backups.

**Missions:** Wayne reported that a total of \$1,509 has been sent to "Convoy of Hope". These funds came from the soup supper donations, silent auction proceeds and donations to Missions during January. Rahab Ministries Board is in place and the goal is to place candidates in June. They are working to fill accountability teams. NCLL legal team has prepared contracts and applications. Paint by Neighbor discussion is in the works for this year's projects. Wayne would still like to power wash the tables and chairs in Wesley Hall.

**Congregational Care:** Sherry reported there was one funeral in January. Birthday and anniversary cards were sent. The February 13<sup>th</sup> Valentine's luncheon was postponed to February 27<sup>th</sup> due to the weather. We are going to prepare for 40 people.

**Reaching and Receiving:** Lori shared an update on the Pictorial Directories. We expect to see the final proof back from the printers this week. It will be reviewed just one last time, and then it will be sent off to the printers for our 200 copies.
