A note from Pastor Phil...

During my devotional time this morning I came across the testimony of a young Russian Muslim woman. She tells the story of her sister being shunned from the family for converting to Christianity. She continued to meet with her sister in secret, trying to convince her to return to "true faith." She prayed to Allah daily to return her sister to her faith and family. One day she decided to read the Bible so she could prove to her sister that Jesus was only a prophet, not the second person of a Triune God. She found as she read the Holy Scriptures that she was finding a peace in truth that she had never before experienced. Then she came across this scripture in John chapter 14:


Jesus answered, "I am the way and the truth and the life. No one comes to the Father except through me. - John 14:6

She became convinced that Jesus is much more than a prophet, and in truth, the way of salvation for all humanity. No one comes to the Father except through Jesus. She prayed for Jesus to enter her life as she sought to live her life to His glory. Today she is a Christian Missionary in Eastern Europe.

This story provides hope, but also sorrow. We know the hope of redemption and peace in Christ Jesus, but for some it may come at a cost in family, community - even their own well being. What risk do I have in choosing Jesus as my Lord and Savior? Perhaps a risk to my social life?

Our culture describes these days in which we are living as "Post-Christian." Our society has evolved beyond the confines of Christian morality. I find this confusing, as it would appear that as society moved away from loving God we have also ceased to love neighbor. There is no acceptance of another's point of view, and in fact our society is so fractured that to disagree is to be like an enemy. I do not find a greater peace or joy than is promised if we live our lives in Christian faith and God's glory. Yet it seems as if our culture is prepared to double down in pursuit of a worldly joy, which scripture promises is beyond eternal reach. But in Jesus, there is the promise of joy, peace, and grace.

So how did we - a nation established on the foundation of Christian faith - become this culture where the majority are lost in the world? I believe it is the sin of silence and apathy... perhaps since we do not have any real risk in sharing our faith that somehow it has diminished in value. Are we still a people who seek to love God and love neighbor?

As we view this world lost in its own worldly desires, who do you know that needs to hear this truth so that they may know and believe?

MMC Single Board - April 15, 2025 6:00 p.m. - Conference Room

Present: Bill Scanlan, Wayne Birkenholz, Paul Lyman, Beth Mueller, Bruce Nodurft, Lori Snyder, Charlie Dighton, Sherry Goranson, Pastor Phil, Mark Reth, Jean Gross.

Mark called the meeting to order followed by a sharing time from Ephesians 2:10. "God planned for us to do good things and to live as He always wanted us to live. That's why He sent Christ to make us what we are." He shared an inspirational article on "What is Good." Prayers and praises were lifted up followed by a prayer for guidance from Mark.

Finance: Bruce shared that actual expenses through March 31 were \$58,543 and actual income was \$56,856 leaving us with a small deficit of -\$1,687. He reminded everyone to turn in a "greenie" when reimbursement is expected so that the proper accounts can be charged for bookkeeping purposes.

Trustees: There are two new members on the Trustee team: Dan Kunde and Blake O'Connell. Discussion was held about purchasing a floor buffer for Wesley Hall. The old church buffer is worn out. Pastor will talk to Ken about this so he can find something adequate for the needs. Estimates for the south ramp are being taken and the old garage will be removed sometime this year and a new small storage shed will replace it. A doorbell has been mounted on the east entrance for anyone wishing to use that door. Lynne will open that door.

Christian Ed: Paul reported that Kaci Reth and Jeanne Bardgett agreed to be in charge of VBS this year. Materials have been ordered. There will probably be five confirmation students next spring. Kristin Milroy will help teach that class but needs someone able to help as a substitute.

Missions: Wayne shared that \$655 was raised for Heifer International in March. May mission will be "Pay It Forward" and June will be HACAP. Paint by Neighbor will happen in June. The plan as of now is to power wash the tables and chairs from Wesley Hall in the parking lot, but they are looking for other projects to do also. Julie Porter is preparing to lead the Ice Cream Social event this summer. Anyone needing yard/landscape cleanup assistance - this will be done after Easter.

Worship: Beth shared that there will be several opportunities to worship during Holy Week and Easter Sunday, including a special service on Wednesday of that week.

Reaching and Receiving: There are still copies of our new pictorial directories available. The cost of the directory came in less than expected so there is a surplus in that fund for future use. Pastor and Debbie's picture will soon be in the hallway upstairs with the other pictures of previous pastors.

Congregational Care: There were no funerals to report. Cards have been sent for birthdays and anniversaries. Easter cards will go out to the GNH and Meadows. Several visits and phone calls were made. Discussion was held on the outcome of the recent Congregational Care District Conference held at Delhi. Carnations will be give out on Mother's Day as usual. We are looking at a different source for these this year. The fall birthday celebration for those 75+ is being planned. Wayne Birkenholz will be sharing his experience on raising bees and collecting honey. We will also plan to give out prayer shawls to anyone who would like one as there is an overabundance in the storage room.

Discussion was held on our Safe Sanctuary Policy which needs to be shared with the Conference. This was updated a few years ago, so we will see if any changes are needed.

Meeting was adjourned at 7:15 followed by the Lord's Prayer and singing of the Doxology. Our next regularly scheduled meeting will be May 20, 2025 at 6:00 p.m. in Wesley Hall.
